Dee Humphrey and Shelley Stone did a fantastic job with the March program "Photoshop Elements- the basics and more" a good turnout of members received good instruction on how to improve the quality of their images.

On our field trip to Shaver Lake, we were rewarded with some pretty good displays of Poppies, Lupine and other wildflowers. I organized this field trip with short notice to the membership so I wasn't surprised at the light turnout. It was a beautiful day and we had many opportunities to shoot images other than wildflowers. We will have earlier notice the next time.

This weekend is the San Joaquin Valley International Exhibition judging. Saturday the 6th and Sunday the 7th in Madera at the Social Services office on Yosemite Ave. north of Lake Street. Starting time is 9:00 a.m. The thirty two hundred or so images that were submitted by some of the finest photographers from all over the world will be judged all day. Breakfast snacks and lunch will be available as well as dinner, after the judging is completed. There will be three judges and the average score of each image, between the three judges, will be the final score. Please attend, you will not be disappointed!

This is a great time of the year for shooting anything outdoors as the rain leaves behind some of the greatest cloud formations of the year. Remember, if you don't point your camera and release the shutter, you will not get perhaps the finest image ever to be captured by mankind.

Camera Kit: Nikon D700, Nikkor 17-35mm (at 17mm)

Settings: f/8, 1/350s, Aperture Priority, Matrix Metering,



Story behind the print ...

With its variety of scenic options, one of my favorite photo locations is Point Lobos SNR. While I'm never quite sure what conditions to expect, I always enter the reserve with high expectations tempered by an unpredictable Mother Nature. Sure enough, when I arrived on location, I was greeted with overcast skies, flat light, calm seas, and low tide. I was pretty sure I was in for a bit of challenge to get a "keeper" - let the fun begin!



I decided I wanted an image that captured a large field of view

so I opted to use my wide-angle zoom lens. I took a few images handheld from various locations, and finally found a place that appealed to me. I was impressed by the texture of the rocks and moss, and how they told a story when the tide was low. Getting low in the rocks, with a wide-angle lens, really opened the view to the ocean and horizon, and still allowed the rocks to dominate the image in the context of its surroundings.

I set my tripod head a few feet off the ground, attached my camera, sat in a "semi-comfortable" position, dialed in my camera settings, and began taking pictures. I took my time, trying different compositions until I was satisfied with my captures. I was impressed how making minor movements to my setup changed the image for better or worse.

I shoot in Raw format (Nikon NEF) because I believe it gives me more latitude in pulling out image details, color, contrast and dynamic range. The tradeoff (over JPEG) is that my raw files rarely look good when I first open them on my computer. The files appear flat and always require some adjustments (a.k.a. post-processing). My primary "digital darkroom" is based on Adobe Photoshop CS5.1. I use the software for raw conversion, post-processing and printing; I also apply Nik and/or Topaz filters when necessary. Once I have the image the way I like it on my computer, I make some small proof prints and "tweaks" until I'm satisfied with the output quality. Lastly, I'll print and mat a larger final image for club competitions.

And there you have it ... Low Tide Textures!

#### "DID YOU KNOW?"


The San Joaquin Valley Council Bulletin, dated 'Spring 1969' had as the cover picture, a desert scene by Fred Hankins of the Taft Club. As most of our members know, Fred Hankins is the grandfather of Shelley Stone and Dee Humphrey.

He was a great photographer and has prints hanging in the Smithsonian in Washington D.C. He was famous for his desert scenes.

He also was one of the founding members of The Photographic Society of America.

Reading on into this bulletin, I found these interesting paragraphs: "The San Joaquin Council met for their first competition of 1969 at the Hacienda Motel, Fresno, on February 9th in the Murrietta for projection and the Palamino for the luncheon just off the patio in the south wing." (Those of us who have been in Fresno a long time may remember the Hacienda).

Under "NOTES TO REMEMBER" in this bulletin: "A limit of \$3.00 was set for the coming year, of which 25 cents is to be withheld for the Council expenses. The restaurants are constantly wanting to raise prices, BUT they all can put on a good luncheon for \$2.50, if they so desire. There will be a registration fee at all work-shops of 50 cents with a total of \$3.50. There is a good plate lunch with soup, rolls and coffee for \$1.45. So it can be done."


