About Steve-

Weaving history, philosophy, and the natural world with artmaking, I adopted photography as my primary investigative and contemplative tool. A passport for interacting with the world it fostered discovery as well as communication. The activities of doing photography and teaching it became my life's work. I instructed field workshops for the University of California, Santa Cruz Extension from 1977 through 2007. From 1984 to 1990, I was an assistant instructor and director one of those years for The Ansel Adams Gallery Photography Workshop in Yosemite. In 2002, I served as a cocoordinator for the "Ansel Adams Centennial Symposium in Yosemite, Edges and Intersections: The Evolution of Change". Devoted to facilitating art and education in Central California for the last forty plus years, I have served as curator, juror, and consultant for countless exhibitions, competitions, and media events, in addition to teaching photography full-time at Fresno City College. In 1980, I expanded the idea of a local gallery devoted to photography by gathering charter members to create Spectrum Art Gallery. It is still providing valuable services to the community as one of the longest running, non-profit, cooperatives of its type in the United States. In numerous one-person and group exhibitions as well as publications, my works have been seen throughout the country.

Inspired by visual wonders in cinematography and still photography, the 1969 LACMA Exhibition "Dada and Surrealism", and especially the instruction of Jerry McMillan, I migrated from philosophy and film studies at U.C.L.A, to still photography. After a series of challenging life transitions, doing photography at every opportunity and teaching it became my career. My "post-graduate" experiences continued to inform my work over the following years as instructional assistant in workshops with Ansel Adams, David Bayles, Paul Caponigro, Martha Casanave, Carl Chiarenza, Linda Connor, Robert Dawson, John Divola, Oliver Gagliani, Ernst Haas, Wanda Hammerbeck, David Hockney, Michael Kenna, Annie Leibovitz, Sally Mann, Richard Misrach, Ted Orland, John Pfahl, John Sexton, Todd Walker, Cole Weston, Jerry Uelsmann, and others. As curator and facilitator of various exhibitions and workshops I also continued to learn through working with many other wonderful artists including Edna Bullock, Christopher Burkett, Dan Burkholder, Charles Cramer, Christofer Dierdorff, Richard Garrod, Norman Locks, Margaretta Mitchell, Susie Morrill, Willie Osterman, Rondal Partridge, Riujie, and Alan Ross.

In my artwork, major influences have been the photographic workflow and philosophies of Wynn Bullock, Jerry McMillan, Imogen Cunningham, Ernst Haas, and Ansel Adams. Philosophy, world history, visual art and its' history have been constant companions.

Through a multitude of one-person and group shows, my works have been exhibited and collected throughout the United States in Museums and Galleries and collected in many public and private collections. In addition to "Black & White" Magazine, "LensWork Quarterly", "Color" Magazine, "Focus" Magazine, "Photography" by London, Stone, & Upton, and "Exploring Color Photography" by Robert Hirsch, The Press at California State University, Fresno recently published my book, "Trail of Stones: My Path in Photography".

Daniel Sniffin— January 6, 1942 - February 28, 2022

It is with profound sadness that Dan Sniffin's family announces his passing at the age of 80 years. Left with the memories of a life well lived, we say goodbye to Dan, loving husband, father, grandfather, brother and friend. Dan was born on January 6, 1942, in San Francisco, CA, to Grant Calvin Sniffin and Inez Jesse (Killingsworth) Sniffin. Following a brief illness he died peacefully at home on February 28, 2022 surrounded by loved ones. He was preceded in death by his parents, brother Robert A. Sniffin, sister Terri Lynne Sniffin-Frazier, nephew Robert Sniffin and granddaughter Kaitlyn Dadian Parker.





Dan was an extraordinary man of many passions. He was a member of the Bakersfield College Mixed Choir and competed in the 1965 Eisteddfod International Music Festival in North Wales and won by one point. They were honored to attend a private audience with Pope Paul VI and they were invited to perform for President Lyndon B. Johnson in the Rose Garden of the White house. At the 50th reunion of their victory Dan helped to spearhead the creation of a documentary of their experience. One Heart<>One Voice, premiered in October 2017 at Bakersfield College with two standing ovations.

Photography was a lifelong passion and his images have graced homes, businesses, hospitals and private collections internationally. He had an exquisite eye for detail and composition and sharing his vision. He formed many rich and enduring friendships through his photography.

Dan's professional career spanned 55 years, ten years with New York Life and 45 years with State Farm Insurance. His production and dedication to serving his clients allowed him to travel extensively. His professional high point was achieving State Farm's Crystal Excellence Award, requiring twenty consecutive years in their Legion of Honor. He served three generations of policyholders with the same daily mission, do the right thing every time.

Dan's passion for genealogy and remembering the lives of his ancestors spanned 50 years and led to indepth research of the American Civil War. In his later years he turned to writing his memoirs and family history for the benefit of future generations. He wrote multiple personal essays and a history of his family titled, Ever So Great.

Dan is survived by his wife, Denise Dadian Sniffin, son Scott Sniffin and his wife Traci; and their three sons, Cameron, Cole and Connor, of Scottsdale, AZ; daughter Lane Rebelo and her husband, Andre, and their

children Clara and A.J. of Boylston MA; sister Sandra Sniffin-Doll and her husband David of Fresno CA; Natalee London and her husband Jason and their son Micha of Madera CA and two great grandchildren Audrey and Austin Parker of Virginia Beach, VA., along with many nieces, nephews, cousins, friends, business associates, Susan Mosley his assistant of 32 years and his precious Aussies.

He will be remembered by all who knew him for his integrity, loyalty, infectious humor and his friendly and generous nature.

Please join in celebration of this remarkable man's life, which will be held on Monday May 2nd, at 1:00 at the San Joaquin River Parkway 11605 Old Friant Road Fresno CA 93730.
