Camera: Fujifilm X-T1 mirrorless Lens: Fuji 50mm prime (equivalent to 75mm) f 3.6, 1/60 sec, ISO 500 Shot with diffused window light (at floor level) about 5' from window converted to Nik Silver Efex Pro 2 to change to Black and White. Some lifting of shadows for detail, slight accentuation of vignette, Sharpening in photoshop.



**Ospreys** Mating

Patt and I discovered this Osprey's nest on the San Joaquin River at the east end of Sycamore Island. It's an easy hike of about 3/4 miles to the site. The photo was taken with a monopod stabilized Sony a7r IV camera. The lens was a Sony 100- 400 with a 1.4x tele converter attached. I photograph birds in aperture priority while controlling the minimum shutter speed, the iso is set to auto. For this shot the settings were: Lens at 560mm, aperture f/8, shutter speed 2000, giving an ISO of 500.








Oregon Eclipse

This picture of the total solar eclipse in Oregon is twelve images stacked together with the help of Photoshop. I probably should have used "layers", but instead I stacked a bunch of .png images together to create one image. Transitioning the horizon from bright grey-blue to eventual black was the most chal-

lenging job during editing. The images were taken with a Nikon dF camera on a tripod. The eclipse phases are all at 900mm, which I achieved by combining two old lenses: a Nikkor 300mm and a Soligor 3x teleconverter. Most phases of the eclipse were shot at f8, 1/125 sec. All non-totality images needed a solar filter on the lens. I took off the filter about 10 seconds before totality and unintentionally recorded the wispy-looking flare, which I decided I liked. Totality lasted a little more than two minutes. The location was near a small town called John Day, Oregon.




### **PSA Galleries**
