Reflected Clouds at Swanson Meadow

This photo, of clouds reflected in a pond at Swanson Meadow (along Dinkey Creek Road), was taken on September 19th, at about 8:00 AM, using a Canon Eos 5D Mark III, and shot on a tripod. The lens was a Tamron 24-70 mm, set at 24 mm. Exposure settings were aperture priority, f/11, ISO 800 and 1/250 sec. There is no cropping, so the view here is the same as in the viewfinder at the time of the shot. Almost all post-processing was in Lightroom. In post processing, while I often use the Orton effect (by creating a layer that has a

high degree of blur and contrast, and then setting that layer to about 15-20% opacity) I didn't do so here. I instead softened the image by globally decreasing clarity in Lightroom. I stumbled upon this trick accidentally, but found that it works well in some images to yield a slight glow, and if used more strongly, a

"painterly" effect. The texture is also adjusted downwards very slightly. I decreased the highlights more strongly (almost to zero) to bring out detail in the clouds. I think I also decreased vibrance a bit (I don't have the original Lightroom file for precise settings). I increased the exposure very slightly in the distant meadow and forest using a luminosity/ color mask. I then imported the image into Photoshop where the only changes there involved my first use of the new "generative fill" feature, which I think worked well here. At the bottom left corner of the photo were some rocks and gravel that form part of a drainage system that takes water beneath Dinkey Creek Road. It was not possible to find a framing (that I liked) that captured the reflection and left out the rocks; I also thought that the pond looked better closed anyway. So a combination of generative fill (using "grass" as a prompt), and a little bit of cloning, replaced rocks with grass. Overall, though, this photo has very little post-processing compared to my other photos. I can't help but wonder if getting everything as close to "right" during the shot is part of the reason that this is my first photo to rate at a club meeting.





Muted Morning Gathering

The image is another of many taken at the Merced Wildlife Refuge. The date was 12/23/2020 at 08:46.

The Sandhill Cranes had not yet left the Refuge to forage and were gathered nicely in front of a photogenic background. The morning fog is/was an important element of this image for the soft muting effect it imposed.

I was attracted to the pattern and spacing of the near birds and the "falloff" of sharpness and vibrance as the eye proceeds through the image to the back of the scene. There is a subtle texture added to the image in post processing.

Equipment used was my trusty Nikon D850 mounted with a Nikkor 300mm f/2.8 handheld to pan birds in flight. Exposure was manual, 1/2000 at f/2.8, ISO 3600 with Pattern metering.

Post processing started with RAW editing in DxO Photo Lab (due to its superior noise handling), major editing done in PhotoShop and the finishing touches done in NIK Software.

"ADVANTAGES OF HAVING PSA MEMBERSHIP

PSA has a <u>Personalized Image Evaluation Service</u>. This service is especially helpful if the maker wants to have his/her skills evaluated, if the maker would like to know what constitutes an acceptable image in one of the PSA Divisions, or for previewing Images before entering them in club competition or a PSA recognized Exhibition.

PSA also has an **Image Analysis Course**, which is helpful in judging ones own photos or becoming a certified judge.
