### 3) Council Field Trips

Any members with ideas for field trips, this spring or at any time, please pass them along to me. Jim Cunningham and Tom Frazier have suggested a "Day of the Dead Festival" trip to San Francisco on November 2nd.

# 4) Scoring in prints and digtial images

A score of "7" or below now means that **those images may not be re-entered** in that Division. The policy of the judge giving the maker suggestions about changing some aspect of the image and the having the option to re-enter it no longer applies. At first we may have to remind a few judges of this. Any images receiving a "7" in 2012 or earlier may be re-entered, but images judged in 2013 or later may not.

# 5) New Class in Monochrome Prints

In the Monochrome Prints Division, a Class of AAA has been created and the three top scoring members of last year's Class AA will be the first to compete in this class. The number of people in the class will be increased in future years until it reaches six (6).

#### 6) Class Sizes

The Board members decided to standardize the sizes of Class AA (8 individuals), Class AAA (6 individuals) and Class A (unlimited) for all the the digital and print Divisions. In some classes this required moving several of the lowest scoring Class AA individuals to Class A. Check with your Club Representative if you are not sure in which class you will be competing for each division.

**Mr. H. S. (Hanna) Barsam, APSA** joined PSA in 1955 and received his APSA at the Houston Conference in1960. From the time he joined through the 1960's, he exhibited extensively in PSA International Exhibitions, winning many medals and awards as well as being a much sought-after judge. He was an accomplished monochrome printer and in the early 1950's was instrumental in establishing the Fresno International Salon, which at that time was exclusively black & white prints. In 2010, he was honored by PSA with a 55 year Milestone Certificate.

Hanna also joined the Fresno Camera Club in 1953 and at the time of his death was the oldest member in terms of continuous membership. He later joined the Madera Camera Club, Selma Chroma Club and the San Joaquin Valley

Council. He was an active member of all the clubs , as well as PSA, until his passing at age 86 in Fresno CA on January 14, 2013 after a brief illness.

Hanna was an avid outdoor photographer, his favorite subject being Yosemite, where , in the mid-1960's, he could be seen almost every week-end in his bright red Jaguar XKE. Later in life he fell in love with Death Valley as a favorite photographic destination, spending many weekends exploring and photographing the local environs and ghost towns.

After many years of personal and camera club photography, in 1977 at the age of 51, he decided to go commercial, specializing in Architectural Photography until he retired 27 years later. Hanna was a very giving person and always willing to share his photographic expertise with others.

# Gold Rush International Open Division and Gold Rush International Creative Division presented by Sam Shaw FPSA, MPSA

This is the third year for the Gold Rush International Exhibition. Photographers from all over the world are invited to submit eight images to be judged for the exhibition, four images in an open pictorial category and four images in a creative pictorial category. Three judges rate the images from one to five points and the top rated images receive medals, ribbons and are included in the show. The Gold Rush International Exhibition was started to help the ailing treasury of the Gold Rush Chapter and has so far provided \$4,500 to the Gold Rush Chapter and these funds were used in part to purchase a new laptop and digital projector. In 2012 we had a decrease of about 17 percent of the entries in 2011. We did receive a total of 2,003 images and the 2012 show contains the top 601 of these images. Images were received from 41 countries. I am also happy to report that 15 members of the Gold Rush Chapter supported the exhibition by submitting their entries. Look for Sam's email at the end of the summer with information and forms to enter your best images and support our club's money making world wide competition.
