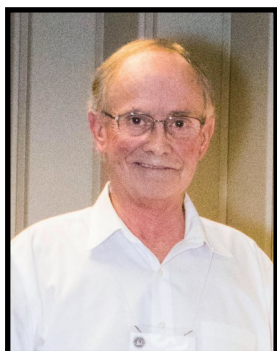

Market Stairs

Market Stairs: This was a vacation shot taken in Budapest last September. They have a wonderful indoor market which attracts locals and tourists alike. The Great Market Hall was built at the end of the 19th century for that purpose and after restoration in the 1990s is one of the major attractions in Budapest. It is multistoried and has shops and vendors of all sorts from butchers to produce to clothing, etc. Well worth a visit when there. This particular shot I liked because of the angles and colors. I had to wait for traffic to clear, it is very crowded mid-day, before getting a relatively clean shot. This was a handheld nine exposure HDR DNG file taken with a Sony a7riv and Sony12-24mm combination. F/5.6, ISO 1600, at 14mm. Exposures at 1/3200-1/13 seconds. Developed primarily in Photoshop, lots of perspective adjustments, dodging and burning through luminosity masks, sky replacement, and somehow the rabbit snuck in at the top of the stairs.

Shortly after that Jennifer Doerrie showed an image of it at night with the windows lit up and that was my next goal, to see it at night. I went to Las Vegas last January and told my husband, I needed to go see it at night. So I brought my camera and travel tripod. The initial challenge was finding parking because there was an event happening close by, so we parked at the mall and walked over there. We went all around the building to get different angles. Some small challenges were the lights from cars and street lights sometimes shining on the building. I used my Nikon Z6, 24-70 lens. I also used SnapBridge app to do remote photography. Focal length 32, F14, 8 second exposure. Processed in Photoshop and Nik.

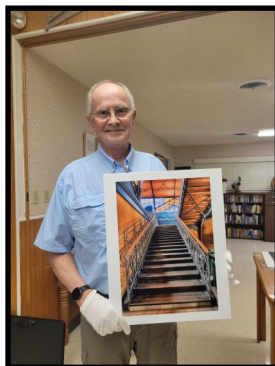

Shot with a Canon 7d Mark II, 500 mm Canon fixed lens, 1000 ISO and 1000th/sec shutter speed.

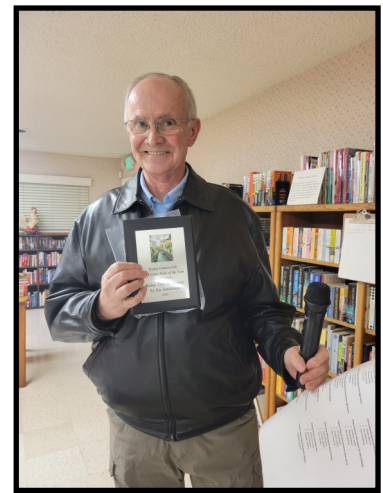
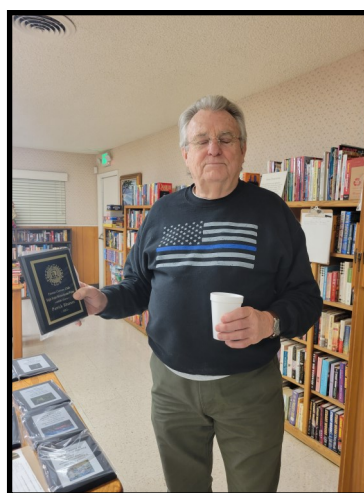

PSA has a **Personalized Image Evaluation Service**. This service is especially helpful if the maker wants to have his/her skills evaluated, if the maker would like to know what constitutes an acceptable image in one of the PSA Divisions, or for pre-viewing Images before entering them in club competition or a PSA recognized Exhibition.

PSA also has an **Image Analysis Course**, which is helpful in judging ones own photos or becoming a certified judge.

These are free services offered by PSA to members. Need a Mentor? Go to

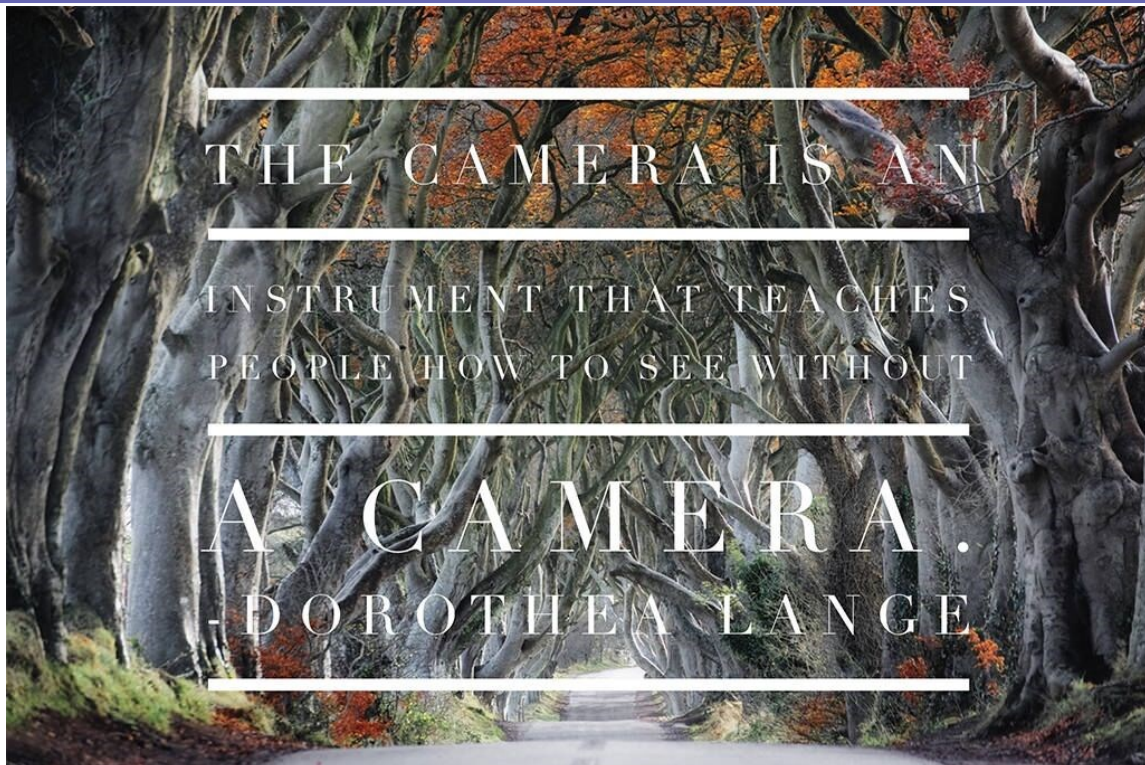
