Polar Bear Photography Tour

A polar bear wildlife safari is truly a trip of a lifetime and there's no better place to do it than in Alaska! On this photo tour, we have a charter flight that will take you from Fairbanks up to a remote Inuit Village on the Arctic Ocean. Once there, we'll head out on boats for close-up viewing of the polar bears on the Barrier Islands. There's plenty of bears to be seen, especially females with cubs. This last fall we had over 35 bears in the area! By going out on boats, we can safely approach the bears and get eye-level shots of them on land and playing in the water/ice. This is a huge advantage for photographers – one that you won't get from a crowded polar bear vehicle in Churchill where you're 20ft off the ground. If skies are clear, chances are good we'll see and photograph the Northern Lights. The trip includes the charter flight, all transportation & guiding, all food, and all lodging. We have two dates set for 2016: Sept 23-28 and Oct 8-13. The October dates are little more expensive since the boat operator charges a premium due to all the ice we'll have to break through. The

Oct dates will have the most winter-like conditions. I've been doing these trips for several years now and everyone has had rave reviews and a great experience! If you're interested in extending your trip, I also take people up the Dalton Highway to see arctic wildlife like caribou and musk oxen along with spectacular scenery in the Brooks Range.

New PSA Definition for Photo Travel Effective January 2016

Clarifications concerning the Updated Photo Travel Definition:

A Photo Travel image expresses the characteristic features or culture of a land as they are found naturally. There are no geographic limitations. Images from events or activities arranged specifically for photography, or of subjects directed or hired for photography are not appropriate. Close up pictures of people or objects must include features that provide information about the environment. Techniques that add, relocate, replace or remove any element of original image, except by cropping, are not permitted. The only allowable adjustments are removal of dust or digital noise, restoration of the appearance of the original scene, and complete conversion to grayscale monochrome. Other derivations, including infrared, are not permitted. All allowed adjustments must appear natural.
