

Humming Bird

The Hummingbird was shot from about 25 ft. with a Sony a7rii on a tripod using a 400mm lens. The bird feeder was in open shade so a speed light equipped with a flash extender was used, providing some needed fill. A shutter speed of 1/1000 was enough to stop motion blur in the wings, it also helped that the little guy was landing and coming to rest. My widest aperture at 400mm is f/5.6 making an iso of 1600 necessary to brighten up the exposure. There was a small issue with noise which was handled with a Topaz filter in Photoshop.






Pipe Organ Abstract






This composition was created from an image of a pipe organ in Iceland. The camera was a Canon EOS 5D Mk III with a 24-105 lens at 35 mm. ISO was 800 with f 5.6 and 1/60 second hand held with Image Stabilization. The composition was created using the Transform tools in Photoshop. 


The Edwards Plaza photo was shot this last winter so foot traffic was not an issue. My camera was a Sony a7rii Mounted on a tripod. The focal length was 23mm. The camera settings were; ISO 100, aperture f/11 and a shutter speed of 3 seconds. The shutter was tripped with a remote release. I re-

turned to the plaza the next morning with my camera mounted on the tripod to find a new composition. As I was setting up security rolled up on a Segway Transporter and informed me I would have to leave. Something to do with copyright. This was a first for me.







Chevy Rust No. 2



This image is a closeup view of the 1937 Chevy Coupe in Bodie State Historic Park (California). Like most visitors to the park, I took the "tourist" picture of the car in its surroundings – I felt the image was good, but hardly unique. I then decided to turn my attention to various sections of the car I found interesting. This view of the grill and right headlight piqued my interest. I liked the composition but felt I needed to emphasize the rust more. Using Adobe Photoshop CS6, I increased the vibrance and saturation to "taste," and bumped the contrast up slightly thus "enhancing the

rust."

The image was captured as a raw (NEF) file, converted to JPEG, and sized to meet FCC digital entry requirements. The equipment used was a tripod mounted Nikon D700, Nikkor 24-70mm @56mm, ISO 200, 1/250s at f/8, and -1EV.
