Well, a funny thing happened when I got to the Forum, last Board meeting. Once all old business was completed, we opened up discussion to new business and started with the "new" scoring scale and the "new" judges we had secured to provide that service in recent meetings.

There was much discussion, both pro and con. We allowed three non-board members who had attended (I kind of suspected to voice opinions on this very subject) to contribute their thoughts.

One of the board members read a letter that voiced several serious criticisms of both the "new" scale and the "new" judges. The most serious assertion made in the letter was that a significant number of (if not most) club members were so unhappy with the new scale and the judging that they were considering leaving the club.

Well, nobody wanted that to come to pass.

The outcome of all the discussion was a vote by the Board to return to the previous scoring scale for competition within the Fresno Camera Club. I mentioned this from the podium, last meeting.

I personally checked with the President of Council and was assured that the Fresno



Camera Club was not bound to follow the scoring methodology of Council.

The Board also voted to begin incorporating some of the "old" judges in with the new for the remainder of the year.

So, there you have it. That describes the end to the recent attempt to change to a different scoring scale.



Male Impala's Fighting for Dominance By: Dr. Ning Lin

It was the fourth day of our Kenya Safari Photo trip. We were in Maasai Mara National Reserve in Kenva. There is a lot of impala in the field. A large group of female impalas in one side and many male ones are in the other side. Many of them are trying to replace the male in the female group. After taking the group photos of impalas, these two male impalas caught my eyes and I started shooting on them. However, seems there is no winner. I think they are going to fight again. Before I could see the result of fighting, we were called to catch a leopard. The image was taken with Canon 5D Mark III with 70 - 200 mm lens at 200mm. Manual setting with auto IOS: F8, 1/800s, ISO 5000.

Surfing By Carol LaGue



I was photographing a horse at Warren Park Stud and liked the attitude of this horse. The backgrounds are usually a problem photographing horses because of fences and distractions. I imagined this horse running free in the surf. I



opened the horse picture and a surf picture I had taken on vacation in Photoshop and minimizing both, making sure the images were compatible. I took the lasso took and cut out the horse, with the mouse I dragged him over to the surf picture. Re sized and placed the horse in my surf picture where I wanted him. I then went in to a close pixel level and with the background removal tool deleted the remainder of the old background from

the horse. Then started blending both images to produce final picture. It is important when blending to always adjust percentage of brush or effect in the edit/fade tool and avoid using at 100%.

Highlights on Color Under a Dark Sky

March 27, 2014 Jonathan Rollins and I went to Yosemite to shoot stuff. It was the day after we were supposed to go up, but something



made us change our plans. At any rate it was during the tail end of a storm that went through the day previous. We shot a lot on the valley floor and on the way out, stopped one more time at the Tunnel Entrance Vista to see what there was to see. Well, this is what we were confronted with. Jonathan actually got to the viewpoint a couple of minutes before me and he took a similar (not exactly the same) image that he has done very well with. In spite of the fact that we, both, have shot many frames from this viewpoint, it never ceases to amaze me how different the view is, so often. The inspiration was the unique play of light on the canyon walls, just at the top of Bridalveil.

The time was almost 6PM. I shot this in a 1 stop, nine frame bracket so that I could process it as an HDR image. I was using a Nikon D800E body with a Nikkor 24-70 f/2.8 lens, focal length 28mm. This, and everything I shoot was in RAW. Auto focus (dynamic 21 point), Center focus, on a tripod (no VR), aperture f/22, shutter speed 1/15s, Matrix metering, ISO 100.

In PhotoShop CC, I combined the 9 images using Nik HDR Efex Pro 2, leaving it at the default preset. I converted the 32bit image to 16bit using the "gamma & exposure +1" method (this is important to maintain the realistic tones of the image). The image was further processed in NIK Viveza 2 and Color Efex Pro2 to optimize the contrast of the clouds and the colors in the granite.

Violet Flower By: Judy Krueger

I found my subject while viewing the beautiful flowers in front of the Parliament Building in Victoria, British Columbia.

What attracted me to these was their color. The weather was slightly overcast, so the light was right just after 5:00 PM.

I was using my trusty Panasonic GX1 Micro 4/3 camera with an Olympus 14-150 mm (28-300 mm equivalent) lens at an equivalent setting of 99 mm. My settings were f/5.4 at 1/800 sec at ISO 200. My quality setting was RAW.

With Guenter's help I used Photoshop Elements 12 for post processing. In the Camera Raw Converter I principally used the Exposure, Highlights, Shadows sliders. I also use the Contrast and Clarity sliders minimally. In the Expert mode in Elements, I principally use the Shadows and Highlights tools and Levels tools to correct the light balance. Both of these are found under

Enhance\Adjust Lighting. After resizing I used the Adjust Sharpness tool under Enhance.




