From the President's Desk

Greetings fellow photogs;

I want to address the elephant in the room: Judging.

I've heard the grumbling and the displeasure concerning recent judging and I want to share with you, my thoughts. They are no more valid than yours, but I hope you consider them with openness. The Board reacted to concern that, historically, up until this year, we counted on the same small group of judges; some of them actually club members, to volunteer their time to judge our images every month.


It may come as no surprise that it was becoming more difficult to get commitments from the members of this small group. I tried, I know. That was the prime reason for developing another group of judges who had never judged before.

I will also admit to you that, at least in the opinions of some of board members, many of the judges we were using were inconsistent in their verbal assessment of our images and the score that they gave it. None of the board members disputed that the judge can do whatever they want to in his/her work, but too many times we heard legitimate criticism of an image and then "but I like it anyway, I'm giving it a 10". In fact, in my humble opinion, there was a heavy propensity to award questionable 10's or 9's (mine included).

And so, the secondary reason for developing another group of judges was to acquire critiques that were more realistic. We arranged for a full year of working photojournalist professionals to provide judging for this year.

The good thing about this turn of events is that it has provided us with "real world" experts who judge images every day and who have been doing it for significant career tenures. I'm not inclined to believe that I have the credentials to argue with any of them when it comes to photography.

The bad thing about this same development is that they tend to be much more conservative in their scores and we don't get as many high numbers as we had become accustomed to. Personally, I have not received one 10 from any of the "new set" of judges, thus far. My ego suffers. As one club member voiced, it isn't as much fun.



But, I also believe that these judges, to a man thus far, are consistent in their critiques, albeit brutally candid, at times. And, they capably articulate what they see in the images, both good and bad. I cannot argue with any of the criticism any have made of my images and, as a result, I believe I learned something and have a higher standard to work toward. I believe I'm actually learning how to make better photographs.

I want to discuss a little more the rating scale we are now using, following in Council's path and adopting what it developed. It may surprise those that feel that these judges are scoring too low. In fact, I want to assure every member that these are the guidelines that we are providing the judges before competition.

Here are the scoring guidelines:

Guidelines for Individual Scores:

- 10 pts. A flawless, memorable image having significant impact. The judge should not be able to find anything to negatively critique in the image.
- 9 pts. An outstanding image without flaws, but it may lack strong impact.



8 pts. - An excellent image, demonstrating strong photographic technique, but exhibiting minor compositional or technical flaws.

7 pts. - A very good image, but it falls short of being an excellent image.

6 pts. - A technically satisfactory image, but lacking in impact, interest, and/or strength of composition.

5 pts. - An undistinguished, unmemorable image with major faults. It shows lots of room for improvement.

4 pts. - An image that lacks interest and good photographic presentation.

3 pts. - An image that fails to meet the requirements of the Division in which it is entered. The Division Chair will provide guidance if you have questions as to whether or not the image meets these requirements.

If you take the time to understand these guidelines, a 10 has to be <u>flawless</u> AND memorable having a <u>SIGNIFICANT impact</u>. Really, how many of those do you think we produce when you compare them to what you see as the best of our craft? I look at my own work and realize that there is a lot better readily available with just a cursory examination of what is on line and elsewhere.

If you look at the definition of a 7, and take the time to understand what it defines, it is not a bad image. It is, by definition, a <u>very good image</u>.

Maybe part of the reason we are reacting the way we are to the new judges is that we have not learned what the new scale is.

And, let's not forget that, after all, we are asking the new judges to follow the scale presented, above, and to give us the benefit of their best opinion (for the remuneration of a spaghetti dinner, no less).

I don't want to rant on and on, so I will close on one last observation. If you look at the goals of the Fresno Camera Club, the very first one is: "To gain understanding of photography, thereby becoming a better photographer". Just like any other endeavor, becoming better requires growth. Growth comes from experiencing effort and criticism. I don't think I grow much at all if I'm told that my work is flawless and is memorable with significant impact when it truly is not.

Personally, I prefer to grow as a photographer.






