Nikon D800E, ISO 800, F11, and 1600 shutter speed. Post processing done in Photoshop CC, and Nik software.








Wildebeest Crossing By **Dee Humphrey**

Turlough Round Tower

This image was captured in August of 2015 during a trip that Jonathan Rollins, his wife, Sandy and I made to Ireland. This subject is in County Mayo in the Northwest quadrant of the Island. This was part of day four activities and the last stop of that day.

We spent a good at least an hour photographing the different angles of the site. We walked back to the vehicle and were actually stowing our equipment in the trunk when I looked up and saw this scene. I unpacked my equipment and took several series of it.

The Nikon D800E was mounted on a tripod and the lens was the Nikkor 24-70mm, f/2.8. Exposure was f/22 at 40mm. Manual exposure mode, Pattern (Matrix) metering.

The image is an HDR rendition and was composed from nine bracketed shots using NIK software. RAW editing was done in Lightroom, Photoshop was used for refinement editing and finally NIK was used to finish the image.

The largest problem encountered in the making of this image was the movement of the clouds in the sky (where else would they be, right?). Because they were moving at good speeds, the HDR was unable to

keep them from "ghosting" and appearing unnatural. To overcome this problem, I selected one of the skies in the nine frames and "dropped it in" to the HDR image using the selection/ masking tools in Photoshop.

Dead Forest



Patt and I noticed this colorful stand of mailboxes while on a Sunday drive. We were on highway 49 just this side of Mariposa, thus the title. I took the photo with a Sony a7rii attached to a 16-35 lens. There are 31 mail boxes in the row so keeping the image sharp front to back was the challenge. This was accomplished using a hyperfocal table. I entered in the lens settings of 19 mm at f/11 which gave me a focal distance of 3.7 ft for my camera. I set my focus at a point 4 ft in front of the lens knowing I would have reasonably sharpness from 2 feet thru infinity.




