


## **President's Maunderings**

Houry and I were in South Africa during April and May. On one of our excursions from the Western Cape we visited Kruger National Park in Northeastern South Africa. We hadn't planned on going to Kruger, but the opportunity presented itself and we were able to go for a four-day trip. Over those four days I took about 5,000 shots of various and sundry landscapes, sunrises, sunsets, and lots of critters. On our second day, about noon, an error message popped up on the camera that there was a problem writing to the memory card. As a result, the camera erased all the stored exposures from the first day and a half of the trip. About 2,300 photos were lost permanently from the card.

I've been shooting digital since 2004. This was the first time that I had a memory card writing failure where I lost all the stored exposures on a card. I reformatted the card and it worked fine for the rest of the trip. I have no idea what happened and had never had a problem with that camera or that card before. In any case, I can remember the pundits always advocating dual memory card slots on digital cameras so that one has a backup. The a7riv does have dual slots that can be configured in a number of different ways and my usual set up was to have the slots set up sequentially so that as the primary card fills up, it automatically switches to the secondary card.

Prior to leaving Cape Town for Johannesburg and Kruger, I decided it might be a good idea to change my usual card configuration and to make the secondary card a full RAW backup to the primary card rather than the sequential configuration that I usually use. As a result, when the first card failed the second card saved the 2,300 exposures that were lost from the primary card's failure. So, I ended up not losing the first day and a half worth of exposures. In the future, probably in most circumstances, but certainly in situations where I won't have the opportunity to shoot a particular subject matter again, I'll set up my cards to be redundant rather than sequential. Also a good idea is to have multiple backup external drives that one can use to download and backup the memory cards. I use portable SSDs to backup my cards.

Stained Glass Monarchs

This image was captured on January 31, 2022, at 10:21 AM. I was with Jim Sanderson and Jonathan Rollins in Pacific Grove, CA, the overwinter terminus location of many migrating Monarch Butterflies. It's not the largest nor the most southern such location but certainly within the range of Fresno Photogs.

Photographing these subjects as they huddle together in the branches of a small Eucalyptus grove is not an easy matter. I waited until the Sun was rising behind me to obtain the necessary lighting, used a long lens (600mm), pumped the ISO up and adjusted other settings to compensate for wind and insect movement and field of focus. This is not the product of bracketed frames rendered in HDR. There was too much movement for that although I would have if I could have.

This image was captured with my trusty Nikon D850, on a tripod and mounted with a Nikon 600mm 1:4 D. Manual mode camera settings were thus: shutter 1/160, exposure f/8, 1 stop over exposure comp, ISO 2500, Matrix metering.

Raw processing was done in Lightroom, developmental editing done in PhotoShop with NIK plugins used for artistic emphasis.

Luminosity masks were used to create depth and richness of color. Most significantly a filter native to Photoshop named "Oil Paint" was used to create Faux brushstrokes and the result was relatively successful.

While in South Africa a couple of weeks ago, Houry and I went to Kruger National Park for four days. The "Blue Starlings" were one of many bird photos I took. For travel I use a Sony a7riv camera. This picture was taken with a 100-400mm lens at 400mm and in crop mode for a 35mm equivalent of 600mm. Traveling in the open safari type vehicle I usually keep the shutter speed high with




an appropriate ISO to match depending on the lighting conditions. Here I was at f/11, ISO 800, and 1/1000s shutter speed. In photoshop, I blended in another sky from the trip to Kruger to add a little interest in the otherwise bland sky together with some dodging and burning and contrast adjustments.

The mountain bluebird (Sialia currucoides) is the state bird of Idaho and Nevada. The Mountain Bluebird is fairly small thrushes with Length of 6.3-7.9 in (16-20 cm), and is a migratory small bird found in mountainous districts of western North America. This one in the image was found in the Bay area. Canon EOS R5 with Canon 100-500mm lens at 500mm, f/7.1, 1/2500 sec, ISO 1250, handheld. The image was processed with Lightroom and Topaz Labs denoise.

## **Judging as a Learning Experience**

We search for the best photo opportunity. We set the camera. We take the shot. We enhance. We crop. We mount the print. We submit the image in competition. We receive a score of seven. (seven is usually the lowest score).

What's important here is everything but the seven. What is important is the experience and the learning from the judging experience.



Judging photos is one of the most difficult and controversial actions that one can initiate. I have judged and I can tell you that it is very difficult to provide critiques on mostly gorgeous photos.

Most judges will tell you that the judging is just one persons opinion. It is more than that. The opinions and critiques teach us that our images are not always as we perceive them and that there can be room for improvement from someone with a non-prejudiced eye, another person's opinion.

Some judges are picky about technical aspects. Some judges see the image from an artistic point of view. It should be both, and usually is.

The great Will Rogers once said "I've never met a man that I didn't like". I have never met a judge that I didn't like and respect. I have agreed on judges opinions and I have moaned, groaned, complained and ran screaming to my mommy. (I exaggerate). In the end I usually come to see the merits of his comments.

In my opinion, a judge in competition that scores sevens, eights, nines, and tens, is a judge doing his job. In the few years that I have entered competitions, I have learned that the constructive comments by the judge, about, not just my photos, but by all photos in the competition, can be a very valuable learning tool.

One cannot and should not get caught up in only the race for highest points, because in the end, it is what we have learned, and how much better we have become as photographers. The points will take care of themselves.

We all like to give judges a bad time now and then, but remember, some of them are people just like us and have families and even close friends (just kidding).



<u>State Rules Apply:</u> As referred to in the Exhibitor Handbook, all state rules apply.

**Entry:** Late entry forms will not be accepted and late entries will not be received. Entry fees are nonrefundable. **NO EXCEPTIONS** 

**Residence:** Open to residents of Fresno County.

<u>Age:</u> Exhibitor must be 18 years old or older on the opening day of the Fair. NO EXCEPTIONS

<u>Titles/Labeling:</u> The Photographer's name, address, division, class and title must appear on the back of the work, or will not be accepted. Only 29 characters will be allowed for titles of entered work. The spaces, quotation marks and apostrophes will not appear on the display identification tags. Data entry errors will be corrected. No other labeling changes will be permitted. NO EXCEPTIONS.

Pick-Up of Exhibits: Any exhibit not picked up by October 21, 2023 at 5PM will be disposed of by the Fair. All checks will be distributed at the time of exhibits pick up. Checks not picked up will NOT BE MAILED. Checks that are not claimed by the

exhibitor or leader will be deemed a donation and will be returned to the department.

<u>Division Selection:</u> Please be sure to enter in the correct division based on your honest assessment of your experience.

## EXHIBITORS MUST CHOOSE ONLY ONE OF THE FOLLOWING THREE DIVISIONS FOR ENTRIES:

1.) AMATEUR - A person who engages in an event or activity as a pastime rather than a profession.

2.) EXPERIENCED - A person who engages in an event or activity as a pastime rather than a profession AND ALSO has extended knowledge and skill beyond novice or amateur photography AND/OR a person who has placed 1st, 2nd, 3rd or Best of Show in the Fresno Fairs Amateur photography division for 2 or more consecutive years.

**3.) PROFESSIONAL:** A person who engages in an event or activity as a livelihood rather than a hobby.

<u>Original Work:</u> All photography submitted must be the work of the exhibitor. No duplicate prints will be allowed. Prints may be processed by a photo finisher. NO EXCEPTIONS

<u>Previously</u> <u>Entered Work:</u> No prints previously entered in The Big Fresno Fair are eligible for exhibit.

<u>Disqualification</u>: The Big Fresno Fair reserves the right to exclude any entry that is deemed not to be in the best interest of the Fair for exhibition. The Big Fresno Fair reserves the right to disqualify any exhibitor who does not conduct him or herself in a manner congruent with the temper, character and purpose of The Big Fresno Fair. In the case of disqualification by the Fresno Fair, its agents, or representatives, <u>THERE WILL BE NO ENTRY FEE REFUNDS</u>. All monetary awards, ribbons and plaques will be subject to forfeiture. Management reserves the right to limit the number of entries exhibited. NO EXCEPTIONS

<u>Display:</u> Entries selected for exhibit must remain on display for the duration of the Fair. Promotional literature, such as business cards and flyers will not be displayed with entries.

Framing & Mounting All photos must be mounted with adhesive on a thin, flat piece of material such as foam core or mat board, NO scotch tape. This must be at least 1/16th of an inch thick, NO cardboard. NO glass or frames are allowed. NO names or signatures on the front of photographs or mats. Prints may otherwise be disqualified. Entrants in the Professional Division attructurempt from this

<u>Hanging:</u> All pictures must be equipped with a photo hanging tab. In the interest of show quality

and protection of exhibits, all photographs must be ready to be hung when they are brought to the fairgrounds. Any improperly prepared photographs may be disqualified. Hanging materials may be purchased at a local art/craft store. The Big Fresno Fair will be selling adhesive hooks at \$1.00 each in the building during receiving days only.



<u>Size Restriction:</u> The minimum size requirement for photos is  $8 \times 10$  inches. The maximum size allowed is  $16 \times 20$  inches. If an entrant chooses to include matting, the entire entry shall not exceed  $16 \times 20$  inches and have no more than a 3 inch mat.  $8 \times 10$  inches must be exposed for viewing.

For Sale: A photographer may set a price for each entry, or leave price blank. However if piece is for sale, a price must be listed on the entry form at the time of submission. All inquiries regarding sale of entries will be referred directly to the artist to complete the sale. The Big Fresno Fair is not responsible for brokering the sales of exhibits.

Judges' Discretion: Judges are contracted and act as agents of The 21st District Agricultural Association, Big Fresno Fair. These individuals facilitate the juried exhibition. They retain the authority to, at their own discretion, move items to more appropriate divisions and/or classes. The judges also may disqualify any exhibit that is not a true representation of the category description in which it was entered.

<u>Placing</u>: The judges may award a first, second, third or honorable mention placement according to merit, and, if without merit, the judges may make no award under any circumstance. This rule applies whether there are one or more entries in the class.

**Best of Show:** The judges shall award a "Best of Show." Winner of "Best of Show" becomes ineligible for 1st place in that division. The 2nd place then moves to 1st, 3rd moves to 2nd and Honorable Mention moves to 3rd.

<u>Popular Vote:</u> People's Choice and Children's Choice Award winners are based upon ballots tendered by Fair guests. Winners will receive ribbons.

<u>Judges' Choice:</u> The Judges will each select a Judge's Choice award winner. A Plaque will be awarded to each.



Awards: The Big Fresno Fair will take every precaution possible for the safety and security of all entries; however, the fair assumes no responsibility and cannot be held accountable for loss or damage. Upon this condition only are entries accepted. If he or she should so desire, the artist may obtain insurance for any item. The Big Fresno Fair does not assume any responsibility for artwork not picked up on the scheduled release dates.

<u>Publicity:</u> The Big Fresno Fair reserves the right to use any print or piece exhibited for publicity purposes.
