After crossing country skiing in Badger pass on January 20, 2019, I went to the Tunnel view in late afternoon. Storm was coming and foggy cloud was moving very quick, finally rain and hail were falling from sky. Leica Q with 28 mm lens. ISO 100, 1/50 sec at F / 8.0, processed in Lightroom and photoshop, converted to B/W with Nik



Image was captured at the Woodlake Rodeo on 5/13/2018 at 17:03. Me and my amusing sidekick, Jonathan, were there to shoot some action shots. Bull Riding always produces plenty of those.

We were on the East side of the arena, so the Sun beautifully backlit the dust raised by the bull. I was using a fast shutter speed to freeze the action and was metering on the rider to get a good exposure. Here are the technical details:

Nikon D850 with a Nikkor 70-200 f/2.8 mounted. Camera set to shutter priority and locked at 1/1000. Auto ISO set to on. Spot metering. Aperture set to f/4.8, ISO autoset to 250, focal length 180 mm.

The image was post processed in PhotoShop and NIK, primarily to dodge and burn and bring forward the important elements of the image.


PSA Galleries
