Death Valley Ripples in Dunes

I love Death Valley in spring and fall; summer, winter. After a one mile walk to the dunes and another half mile into the dunes is where I find no footprints on the dunes and many opportunities to capture some of my favorite photographs.

This image was taken on an early spring morning just after sunrise with a Cannon 5d Mark III, 24mm canon lens, so at 100, f16 aperture setting and a slow shutter speed to get the streaking clouds. Always use a tripod.



This image was captured on Sept. 28, 2021, 11:39 PM while I was visiting family in Culpeper VA. (I was there when Hurricane Rita passed over sending lightning bolts raining down upon us setting a large hardwood snag on fire about 75 yards from the house while I was staring out the windows looking directly in that direction. matic conditions that we can soberly call weather with a straight face.)

What was I doing? Oh, yeah, writing about the Milkbarn.

On the day of this image capture, I was on one of my "backroad" reconnaissance missions (as I am wont to do wherever I find myself) out along Route 522 up into the Blue Ridge Mountain country Northwest of Culpeper. You will instantly know that roadway as the route upon which the infamous village of Scrabble resides. But I divagate. Back to Milkbarn.

As I was reconnoitering for not a long period of time, I observed an interesting collection of buildings out in the rural reaches of Culpeper County and immediately recognized an opportunity for a potential 10 back in Fresno, of the state that has no weather in comparison to Virginia. (Rita had a profound impact on my awareness of REAL weather.) Oops! There I go again. Re-focus, now, Paddy.

The image speaks to the size and condition of the building and its subtly foreboding presentation amid its surroundings, especially in light of the ominous dark, swirling rain cell that had settled in over the top of it. Once I secured permission from the owner to enter his property I went into "Photo Man" mode and set up my equipment.

I set up to shoot the building looking into one of its corners to give the image perspective and depth. I set the camera up to bracket 9 shots, one f/ stop apart.

The most rewarding and awe inspiring trip I've ever been on, Tanzania Africa. For a wildlife photographer, the possibilities are endless. I like to use my Canon 7d Mark II because it has a very fast shutter speed and my Canon 5d Mark III for a little higher quality shot. I took a Canon 500 mm fixed lens, a 100 to 400 Canon zoom lens and a Canon 24 to 105 zoom lens. You will need, at least these lenses on your future trip to Africa. This image was taken with a Canon 5d Mark III, 400 mm Canon lens, f8 aperture, 1000 second shutter speed and 1000 ISO.



Bryce Canyon

This photo was taken in Bryce Canyon on December 30,2021. We went to Grand Canyon, Zion, and Bryce Canyon in the last week of 2021 to shot winter scene. The crimson-colored hoodoos are more outstanding with snow. The image was made with Canon EOS R5 with Canon 16-35mm EF lens at 16mm, f/11, 1/160 sec, ISO 100, processed in Lightroom. This photo was awarded in <u>1x.com</u>, too.

The camera was my trusty Nikon D850 mounted on a tripod. The lens was a Nikkor 24mm of the Perspective Control variety set at f/22 with the focal length fixed at 3 ft to achieve a "hyper-focal" focusing effect. I used manual exposure mode, Matrix exposure pattern, with ISO set to 640.

I was limited to a tripod location by some obstructions around me and knew that I wanted to capture more of the area at both ends of the building than what I was able to achieve from my position. I repeated the above process two more times framing the building to include a little more area at both ends. Of course, the tripod never changed position to make this easier to composite together in post.

In post, I composited the three sets of 9 exposures using NIK HDR Efex Pro 2, composited the three renderings to give me one image with more real estate at both ends of the building, brought it into PhotoShop, did my RAW work with the Camera RAW filter, did some luminosity mask work to enhance dimension and finished with several NIK Color Efex Pro 4 filters to enhance detail and impact. I finished the image using NIK Silver Efex Pro 3.
