

Jerpoint Grievers #120

This is another image from my trip to Ireland in 2018. The location is the 12th Century Jerpoint Abbey Ruin in County Kilkenny. The subject is one of several sarcophagi that exist within the ruin.

What interested me was the highlight and shadow pattern created by the sculpture of the "grievers" or "weepers" that adorn them and the texture of the base and wall behind this particular sarcophagus.



The ambient lighting was uneven which led me to bracket 9 frames, one stop apart in exposure so that I could render the final image using HDR techniques. Hyper focal settings were used to render the image in focus from front to back. The camera used was my Nikon D850 mounted on a tripod. Lens used was a Nikkor 24mm f/3.5 "Perspective Control" which allowed me to set up horizontally level and then "shift" the lens to allow proper framing. Focal length was 24mm and exposure set to f/22, shutter speed varied due to bracketing. Exposure program was manual and metering set to "Matrix (pattern)". Post processing was done, initially in LR for basic RAW work, then Photoshop and NIK to render in monochrome. The "look" of the final product is created by a NIK filter that emulates dark Selenium film processing which "fades" the black point and the white point giving it a subtle artistic look that I am particularly infatuated with at this point in my journey.



Sun and Fog

This was taken on a foggy early morning in December, 2018 at Mendota Wildlife Area, a little spot I passed daily on my way to work.

I did minor editing to increase exposure and saturation in Lightroom and increased the exposure in the foreground. I added a vignette, sharpened the image and blurred the sky slightly.

Fujifilm X-T2 f/20, 1/250 sec, ISO-200, 16mm (equivalent to 24 mm)





Playing in the Surf



I took this photograph from the breach at Estero Bay. I was about half way between Cayucous and Moro Bay shooting pictures of surfers and these two guys came playing in the surf on their wave runners. It was a bright sunny day at about 11 A.M. I was shooting with my Sony ILCE 6000a. Since it was so bright, I set the ISO 125. The f stop was set at 6.3 with a shutter speed of 1/1000 sec. The focal length of the lens was set at 210mm. I was using auto metering. I followed these two riders for about an hour and shot many pictures. This picture caught my attention for the dramatic action. I have learned that you can use a shorter lens, and over shoot giving you great opportunity to crop. I used a number of Topaz programs to enhance the work I do with Photo Shop. I am learning more all the time about the computer programs.

This area is a great place to take beach pictures. There are people, rocks, piers, otters, birds of all kinds, and often beautiful sunsets.



Horton Lake Sunset after Storm

This photo was taken at Horton Lake in Inyo National Forest near Bishop.

The lake located above 10,000 ft elevation in front of Mt Tom. The trail to the lake is about 4 miles with 2000 ft elevation gain. In the morning there was no cloud in the sky but more and more clouds covered the sky in the afternoon. It became thunderstorm in evening. This is very common weather in high Sierra. We have to get into our tent due to raining. Suddenly, the rain was lighter and the sky became orange color. We rushed to the lake.

However, the color changed so rapidly from orange to red when I was just half way to the lake. If I could reached the lake 2 minutes earlier, it would be more vivid red color in the sky and on the lake. The photo was processed with Lightroom and Nik collection. Sony a7R4 with Canon 16-35 mm f2.8 lens at 25mm. ISO 100, 20 sec at f/5.6.


PSA Galleries
