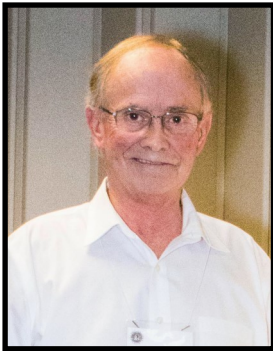

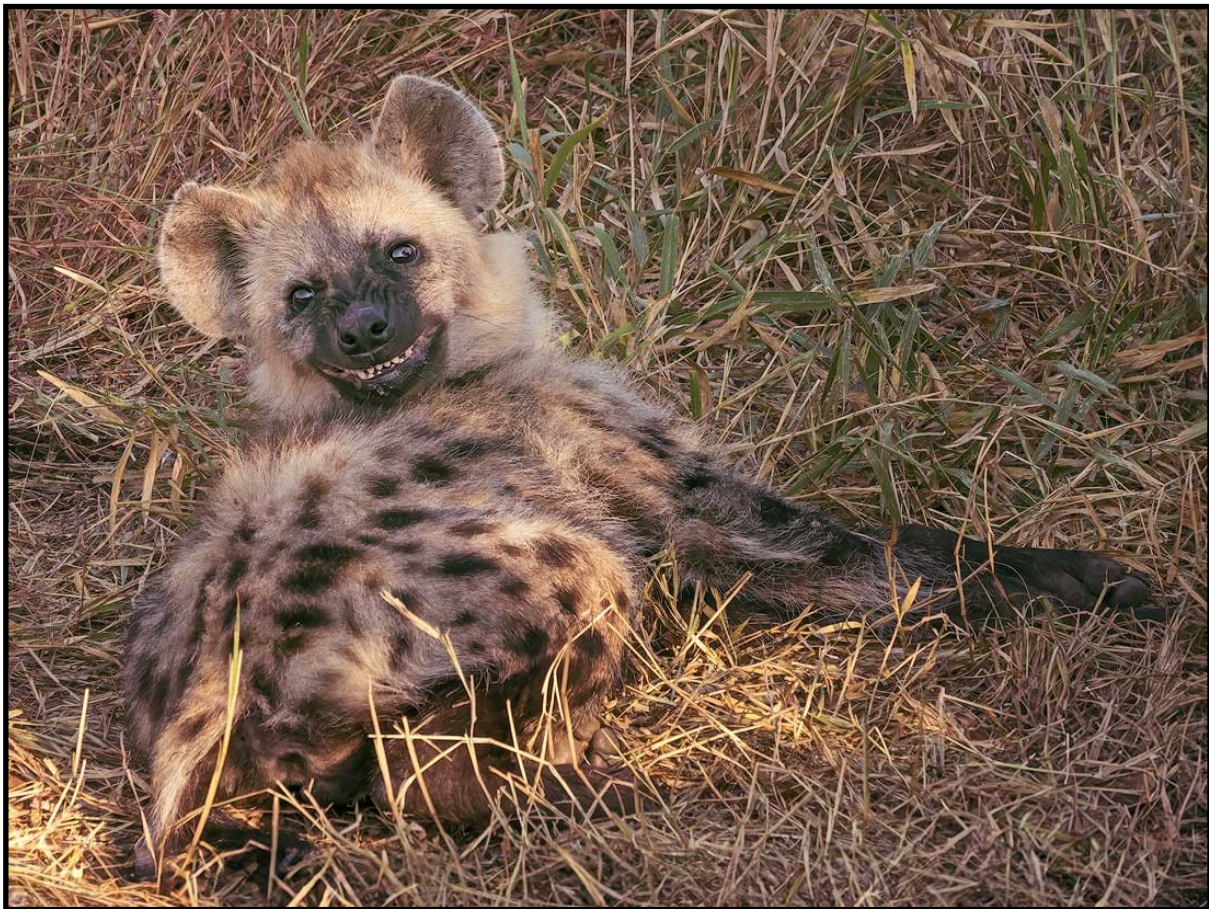
Laughing Hyena Pup Kruger NP

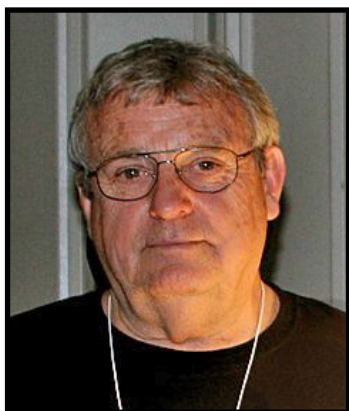

Texture, Patterns and Ferns

This image was captured 10/15/2018 on one of my trips to the Republic of Ireland. The Location is the Glendalough Monastic Complex in the Wicklow Mountains of County Wicklow. The time was close to Noon.

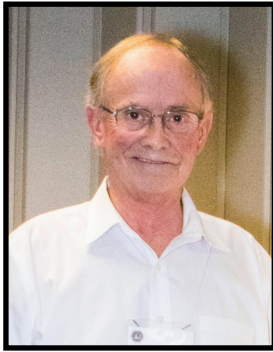
The structure pictured is part of the ruin of Reefert Church, one of the oldest of the structures at the complex. I was attracted to the textures and patterns of the stone and intrigued by the small ferns that grow pervasively on these structures everywhere in Ireland.

The shot is an HDR rendering from 9 bracketed frames. Equipment used was my trusty Nikon D850 with a 24 mm f/3.5 perspective control lens, mounted on a tripod. Settings were as follows: Manual mode, Exposure f/8, Matrix metering, ISO 400, focal length 24 mm,

Post processing was begun in Lightroom for RAW. Major editing done in Photoshop and Artistic adjustments done in NIK software. The image is printed on paper with a matte finish as part of the artistic effect intended.

This service is especially helpful if the maker wants to have his/her skills evaluated, if the maker would like to know what constitutes an acceptable image in one of the PSA Divisions, or for pre-viewing Images before entering them in club competition or a PSA recognized Exhibition.

PSA also has an **Image Analysis Course**, which is helpful in judging ones own photos or becoming a certified judge.

PSA Member Galleries - For All PSA Members

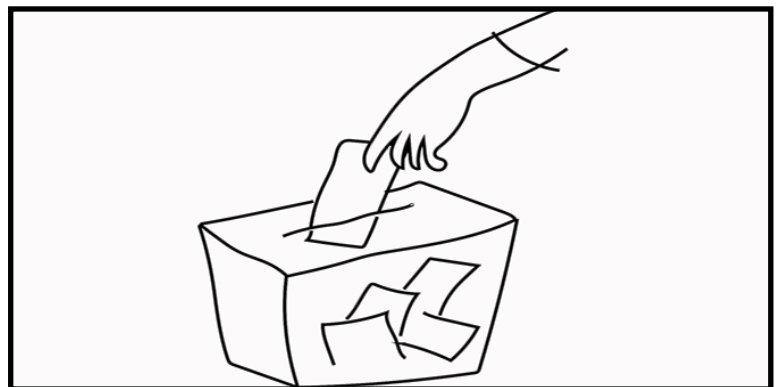
