
About the Fresno Camera Club

Fresno Camera Club is a non-profit organization affiliated with the <u>Photographic Society of America</u> since 1944. The Fresno Camera Club was organized in 1891 by Percy Fenton (Adelsbach) Adams and three friends, with Adams it's President. The club has remained active since those very early beginnings.

We currently have over 75 members and hold meetings monthly, holding a combination of print and digital image competitions for members. Meetings of the Fresno Camera Club meets at 7 p.m. on the Third Tuesday of the month (except July, August and December), at <u>University of California Center, 550 E.
