Anna Hadfield

08/28/1972 - 05/22/2018

Yesterday I lost the love of my life, the other half of me for the last 19 years. My beautiful wife of the last 17 years finally lost her fight against her own immune system.

Anna left this world yesterday at around 2:45 PM, surrounded by many friends and family, all of whom loved her dearly.

To those of you who are finding out by reading this, or other social media messages I apologize, I had neither time nor the willpower to let everyone know before this fast-moving world of social media beat me to it.

Anna had what to most people would be a simple procedure back in April to remove an abscess, we dressed and cleaned it, changing the dressings

many times a day and it looked to be healing well. Sadly she got an infection, this turned into Sepsis and the infection ravaged her delicate body. Her organs slowly failed and she slipped away from us yesterday. What would have been a simple infection for most was so much more for Anna. In 1999, a few weeks before I met her for the first time she was diagnosed with Rheumatoid Arthritis, hers was a vicious and chronic case, affecting all joints in her body. They diagnosed her and she started on many different treatments, that would continue for the next 19 years. RA is a disease where your own immune system attacks yourbody. It made her tired and lethargic, but she never let it win, well most days at least.

She had her daily allotment of "Spoons", getting out of bed, 1 spoon, brushing teeth, 2 spoons, drying hair, 4 spoons. Each spoon represented how much energy she had that day, to battle the stiffness, the pain and her own body. On good days she had lots of spoons, on the bad she might be out of spoons before she got her shoes on, but she never let it prevent her from going to work and doing her beloved job, of nursing and caring for others that couldn't do it for themselves.

The medications she took for Rheumatoid Arthritis suppress your immune system, so you can't fight back. They damage your kidneys and liver, as do the pain medications she took daily to scrape together a few more spoons. Over the last few years, the effectiveness of her medications was lessened, she became allergic to some of the better medications, and switched to alternatives. All the time I watched her lab results get worse, as her blood count decreased, her kidney function got worse and her daily spoon allocation got less.

Yet all this time she never used RA as an excuse, she never got a disabled placard she could have used, instead, forcing herself to walk further than she could have, on feet that were swollen and hurting. She rarely complained, she never let it stop her from trying to do what she wanted to do, even if her spoons were drained.

Many of you reading this may not even know Anna had RA, very few of you know just how much pain she has been in for the last few years. Bad days started with tears, she would pray for the strength to put on her shoes and bra, rarely did she ask for help. I can't think of a single day where her RA stopped her going and doing what she loved to do, to nurse those that needed her love, care and help at the 'Crest. If nursing wasn't enough she volunteered, she ministered to those that needed her help.

What all of you know of my "Cutie-Pie", or your "Anna-Banana" is her golden smile, the warmth in a her heart and her genuine love of her friends and family, and you didn't have to of known her for long to be her friend, sometimes just standing in line at the bank was long enough.

While I feel broken in a way I didn't know was possible, My baby is finally free of her pain, this crippling disease and no longer has to worry if she's going to have enough spoons left at the end of the day to clip her toenails.

Anna leaves behind her Father, Sister, Brother in law, and niece and nephew, She leaves her beloved Peggy-Sue, Diana, Barbara and the other girls at the crest, they are more like family to her than co-workers. Then there is Reta who started out as the family of one of Anna's patients, and is now like a part of the family for both Anna and myself, I don't know who adopted who but it has just seemed right. I know you all miss her and can only imagine how great the pain based on how I feel, but remember her smile and the twinkle in her eyes that would hint at the mischief that was probably only seconds away.

I love you Anna and have no clue how I am going to do today, let alone tomorrow without you at my side, and seeing the twinkle in your eyes and that beautiful smile I always thought you gave away too freely. The world is suddenly a lesser place, the brightest light in many lives has gone out.
